This is a sanctioned, non-qualifying competition conducted under the rules set at the 2009 U. S. Figure Skating Governing Council and in the 2009 USFSA Rulebook. The International Judging System (IJS) will be used on all Free Skate, Championship and Short Program events Juvenile (NOT OPEN JUVENILE) through Senior levels only. A planned program content form must be included with your entry for all IJS events. It is anticipated that events will begin on Friday morning. Practice ice will begin on Friday morning, prior to the first event.

EVENTS

This competition will include the following ladies' and men's events:

Free Skate, Open Limited Beginner-Senior, Adult

Spins: Limited Beginner-Senior

Short Program: Juvenile through Senior

Jumps: Beginner-Senior and Adult

Championship Events: Intermediate-Senior

Pairs: PreJuvenile-Senior

Compulsory Moves: Limited Beginner-Juvenile/Open Juvenile

ELIGIBILITY

Skaters must be eligible persons registered as members of the USFS and may compete at their test level as of August 17, 2009 for each event or one level higher. Championship events, Free Skate, Short Program, Compulsory Moves, Spins and Jumps must be skated at the same level. Skaters are allowed to enter both the Championship and separate Short Program and Free Skating events. Ages are as of September 1, 2009 or, for Adult Events, 8/17/2009.

GROUPS

A large number of entries in some events will be divided into groups as follows: Beginner through Juvenile and Open Juvenile will be grouped by birth date. Intermediate through Senior events and Championship events will be grouped by random draw. For Limited Beginner-PreJuvenile/Open PreJuvenile Compulsory Moves events and all Spin and Jump events, groups with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.

JUDGING SYSTEM

The 2009 Madison Open will use the ISU judging system for Juvenile – Senior (unrestricted) Singles events. All other events, including Open Juvenile Singles, will use the majority 6.0 system. A deduction of 0.2 will be taken for extra and added elements within the 6.0 system.

IJS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

Those skaters participating in IJS judging system events need to submit a PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM with their application or no later than September 1, 2009. Late forms will not be accepted. A Planned Program Content Form can be downloaded or entered at WWW.USFIGURESKATING.ORG. On-line submissions will be accepted.

EVENT CANCELLATIONS

Any scheduled event may be canceled if fewer than two skaters are entered. Due to ice limitations, the Chief Referee reserves the right to limit entries based on earliest postmark or to eliminate events with suitable notification to the entrants and return entry fees for that event.

PRACTICE ICE

Reserved practice ice: Skaters will be able to reserve practice sessions before their events. Practice ice is available at a cost of \$10/session, with a limit of 1 session per event. The length of the session will either be 20 or 30 minutes, to be determined solely by the competition sponsors after the deadline, based on the number of requests received and the amount of practice ice available after event scheduling. Keeping the safety of the skaters in mind, attempts are made to keep sessions separate by skating level. Practice sessions are expected to begin no earlier than 5:00 am on Friday, September 25. Practice ice confirmation and times will be returned with your event confirmation.

Additional practice ice: Remaining practice ice at Madison Ice Arena will be available at the Registration Desk, and sold on a first come, first served basis only, at a higher cost per session. **No phone calls** will be accepted for additional practice ice. Coaches, parents and skaters may purchase practice ice for only one skater at a time. Ice for members of the same family may be purchased at the same time.

REGISTRATION DESK

The Registration Desk at the Madison Ice Arena will be open throughout the competition weekend, beginning Friday morning. Each skater must check in upon arrival, **at least 45 minutes** before each event. If you skate multiple days, e.g., Friday and Saturday, please check in with the registration desk both days to confirm your event.

BULLETINS AND NOTICES

Prior to the event, updated schedules and information will be available at www.fscmadison.com. During the competition, a bulletin board displaying official information will be located in the lobby of Madison Ice Arena where any important information regarding this competition will be posted. Posting on this board will be considered sufficient notice to all competitors.

EVENT NOTIFICATION

A stamped self addressed envelope must be enclosed with your application to received notification of competition time by mail. A schedule of events will be posted on our website.

AWARDS

All Limited Beginner and Beginner event skaters will receive an award for participation. In all other events, awards will be presented to the top four places in each event. Awards will also be given to the top four skaters for the combined short and long programs in initial rounds of Championship events and the top four Championship final round places. Award recipients are encouraged to participate in the awards presentation and photography.

The Dorothy Sinykin Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Intermediate Ladies Championship in memory of Dorothy's commitment to the Figure Skating Club of Madison and the sport of figure skating.

MUSIC

Music will be played from **CD ONLY**. The CD must contain only the selection for the event. Music must be turned in at the time of registration. Music must be clearly marked with the skater's name, event, group, and correct playing time in minutes and seconds. Skaters must have back-up music at rink side during their event. CD's should be picked up following your event. The Figure Skating Club of Madison cannot accept responsibility for unclaimed music.

VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHY

Videotaping and photography services may be provided. You will be notified of the available services with your mailed schedule. If you will be videotaping, please be considerate of others and do so from the top of the stands. No flash photography is permitted in the ice arena. The use of ice arena power sources is prohibited.

RINK

Madison Ice Arena has an ice surface of 85' x 200' with slightly rounded corners. Locker rooms and concession facilities are available.

OPEN FREE SKATE EVENTS

Skaters may compete at their test level as of August 17, 2009 or one level higher. Skaters must compete at the same level for all events. The IJS judging system is used for Juvenile-Senior events, except Open Juvenile. Adults may skate in either Adult or Standard Free Skating events, but not both.

SHORT PROGRAM EVENTS

The Short Program will be offered at the Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels. **Required elements and times are in accordance with the requirements for the 2009-2010 competitive season, as stated in the 2009 Rulebook and the May 2009 Governing Council.**

JUVENILE/OPEN JUVENILE SHORT PROGRAM EVENTS

Juvenile Short Program will be offered in 2009. The event is also open to Open Juvenile skaters. Required elements and times are the same as those listed for Intermediate Short Programs and are in accordance with the requirements for the 2009-2010 competitive season, as stated in the 2009 Rulebook and the May 2009 Governing Council.

CHAMPIONSHIP FREE SKATING EVENTS

Championship Open Free Skating events will be offered at the Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior level. The Championship Event is a combined event consisting of the Short and Long Program. Should entries call for an initial round, it will include both the Short and Long Program; the final round will include only the Long Program. The number of skaters moving from initial rounds to the championship round will be posted at the competition. Skaters are allowed to enter both the Championship events and separate Short Program and Open Free Skating events.

Program requirements are in accordance with the requirements for the 2009-2010 competitive season, as stated in the 2009 Rulebook and the May 2009 Governing Council.

COMPULSORY MOVES EVENTS

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Skaters may enter at their test level or one level higher but all events must be skated at the same level. Juvenile and Open Juvenile free skaters may enter **either** the Juvenile/Open Juvenile Compulsory Moves Event **or** the Juvenile Short Program, but not both. Compulsory Moves are skated without music. The specified moves may be in any order but must be skated exactly. An Axel is a single jump. Connecting steps must be distinguishable from a footwork sequence.

Limited Beginner through PreJuvenile and Open PreJuvenile Compulsory Moves events with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.

**Limited Beginner through PreJuvenile/Open PreJuvenile will utilize half the ice surface.
Juvenile/Open Juvenile will utilize the full ice surface**

SPIN EVENTS

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Skaters may enter at their test level or one level higher but all events must be skated at the same level. All levels will be skated on half ice surface. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be skated in any order. Connecting moves and short sequences of footwork may be used between spins and will not be judged. No music. Limited Beginner through PreJuvenile and Open PreJuvenile Compulsory Moves events with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Skaters may enter at their test level or one level higher but all events must be skated at the same level. Beginner through Juvenile/Open Juvenile levels will be skated on half-ice. Intermediate through Senior levels will be skated on full ice. Jumps should be performed **exactly** as stated. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. No music.

Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile and Open Pre-Juvenile Compulsory Moves events with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.
