**As a reminder, our policy regarding Covid-19 is as follows:**

**If a skater/coach has any of the following symptoms**, they should not come to the rink until symptom free for 72 hours and no sooner than 7 days from the onset of any symptoms:

- Temperature above 99.9 degrees
- New Fever
- Cough
- Sore Throat
- Shortness of Breath
- Loss of Taste or Smell

**Any skater/coach diagnosed with Covid-19** is expected to notify FSCM at FSCMPresident@gmail.com within 24 hours of receiving results and should isolate at home following the guidance of local public health and return no sooner than 14 days from the onset of any symptoms or a positive test.

**Any skater/coach in close contact with a known or suspected Covid case** should also notify FSCM at FSCMPresident@gmail.com within 24 hours of notification, should isolate at home for 14 days after last exposure and monitor for development of symptoms.

**In the event a skater needs to quarantine and will miss contracted sessions, they may request a credit or reimbursement for those sessions if desired.**

If we are notified of a positive case for one of our skaters/coaches, we will notify each of the following:

- All skaters who were on the same session(s)
- FSCM Members
- FSCM Coaches
- MII Rink Management

We would expect you to also notify any other rink, program, or club that you or your skater may be in contact with. Some examples are below:

- Wisconsin Inspire
- Madison Ice Diamonds
- SWFSC Board
- Beaver Dam Swans Board

In an effort to keep our skater's as safe as possible and minimize any potential spread, we will include the skater's name in our notifications so that each family can determine if they were in close contact or not. **If you skate with FSCM, you agree to the disclosure of your skater's name in these communications.**

**Anyone who knowingly fails to notify FSCM within 24 hours will be subject to disciplinary actions up to and including loss of membership with FSCM.**
